XXXVI ANNUAL MEETING OF THE GEOLOGICAL SOCIETY OF POLAND, PIENINY MTS., 1963

The XXXVIth Annual Meeting of the Geological Society of Poland was devoted to the geological structure of the Pieniny Klippen Belt of Poland. On September 19, 1963, the Meeting was opened at Szczawnica, where lectures on the geological structure of the Pieniny Klippen Belt of Poland, a well as on the hydrogeological, geochemical, balneotechnical and medical problems of the mineral waters of Szczawnica, were delivered. On September 20, 21 and 22 geological excursions to various parts of the Pieniny Klippen Belt and its vicinity were led. The problems discussed during these excursions were: the stratigraphy of the Mesozoic and Palaeogene deposits of the Pieniny Klippen Belt and of its border zone, the geological structure and petrographic character of andesite intrusions, the mineral composition and formation of ore-bearing veins associated with the andesites, the relation of the Magura Nappe to the Pieniny Klippen Belt, the stratigraphy, sedimentology and palaeobotanic character of the fresh-water Neogene (Miocene and Pliocene) deposits and, finally, the tectonic structure and origin of the Pieniny Klippen Belt.

About 300 geologists from various parts of Poland, as well as from foreign countries participated in the meeting and in the field excursions. Institute of Geology of the Polish Academy of Sciences

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
